Elfun announces 2010 Service Adventures



From the East Coast to the Wild West to the Isles of Hawaii, Elfun's will have the opportunity to participate in some exciting service adventures. Vermont, Montana, and Hawaii will be the sites for three GE Elfun-Exploritas (formerly Elderhostel) service programs in 2010. "By popular demand, we're going back to the Battleship Missouri and to a picturesque Vermont summer camp," said Elfun program coordinator John Betchkal. "One new program will be an adventure at a history-filled Montana state park."

Preservation and Renovation of a Classic Old Vermont Summer Camp (Program No. 14811) will be offered June 13 to June 18 in Fairlee, VT. Tuition is \$490 double occupancy, and the single occupancy add-on is \$100.

The popular 2009 service activity aboard the Battleship Missouri will be repeated in 2010. Program dates are August 27 – September 3 and will afford Elfun's the opportunity to attend the 65th anniversary of the ceremony on the deck of Mighty Mo which formally ended World War II. Tuition for **All Hands on Deck: Maintaining the USS Missouri** (Program No. 2617) in Hawaii is \$1326 double occupancy. The single supplement charge is \$435.

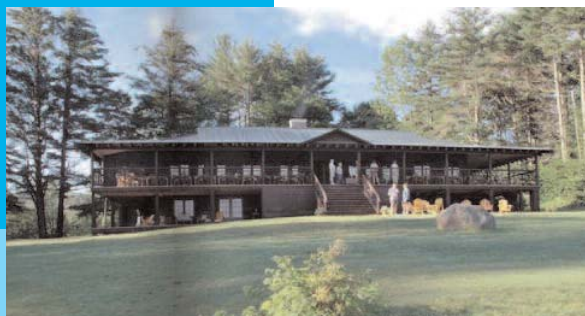


New in 2010 will be an opportunity to work on restoring and maintaining buildings built in the 1800's during the era of Montana's first major gold strike at what is now Bannack State Park. While working on a variety of structures – hotel, saloon, church, livery stable etc. – at Bannack, Elfun's will reside in nearby charming Dillon, Montana.

The **Bannack Service Project** (Program No. 19037) will take place from September 12 – 18. Tuition is \$699 double occupancy. Single supplement is \$160.
