The Ramifications of *Coaxial Cable Connectors*: Reactions From The Business Community & The Bar

Coaxial Cable Connectors & Components Thereof & Products Containing Same, Inv. No. 337-TA-650, provided the most recent insight from the U.S. International Trade Commission regarding the concept of domestic industry as it relates to the “exploitation” of the intellectual property at issue, including: (1) whether certain legal expenses are attributable to the domestic industry; and (2) whether those expenses are substantial enough in nature to satisfy the statutory requirement. Controversially, this opinion also set forth a means by which a non-practicing entity can build and present a successful domestic industry case at the ITC.

Healthy debate continues to abound over the ramifications of *Coaxial Cable Connectors*. The presentation offers a dialogue with members from both the business community and the ITC Bar regarding lessons and challenges that stem from the Commission’s decision and the Administrative Law Judge’s corresponding remand determination. The panelists include: **Buckmaster de Wolf**, Senior Counsel for Litigation & Legal Policy from General Electric Company; **David Djavaherian**, Vice President & Associate General Counsel from Tessler, Inc.; **Jamie D.
