

Transportation

Whether you are looking for transportation to and from the SeaTac International Airport or a leisure tour, Seattle has plenty of options when it comes to getting around:



Shuttles

There are several shuttle companies that serve the downtown Seattle and greater Seattle areas. Visitors who need transportation to and from the airport can arrange it through the Downtown Airporter - (206) 626-6088 , Gray Line Airporter Shuttle - 1-866-235-5247 or Shuttle Express - (425) 981-7000.

To or From Airport Hotels - Seattle's airport hotels offer courtesy van service to and from SeaTac International Airport.

To or From Everett, Bellevue and Tacoma Hotels - Regularly scheduled shuttle service is available to hotels in these areas. Please contact your hotel or see the ground transportation information booths located at the north and south ends of the baggage claim area at SeaTac International Airport.

Waterfront Streetcar Line

This complimentary bus service runs the length of the downtown Seattle Waterfront, from Pier 69 past the Aquarium, through Pioneer Square and ending in the International District.

Bus Service Downtown

The Metro Bus System Underground Tunnel has five stops running from the Washington State Convention & Trade Center through downtown Seattle to the International District adjacent to Qwest Field. The bus service within the Ride-Free Zone (downtown Seattle transit tunnel) is free from 6 a.m. to 7 p.m.

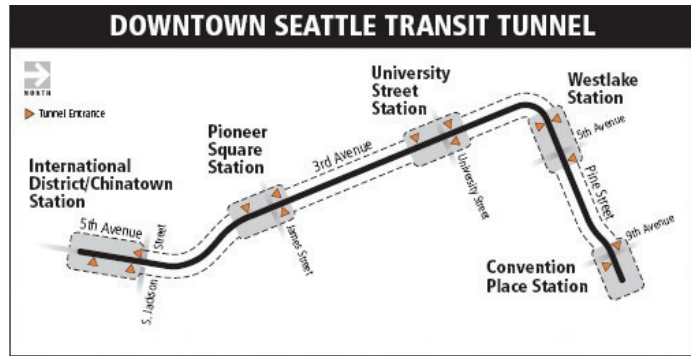

Take the exciting monorail from Westlake Center in downtown to Seattle Center and the Experience Music Project. It is open daily from 9 a.m. to 11 p.m. with departures every 10 minutes. South Lake Union Street Car

The South Lake Union streetcar line runs between Westlake Center through Denny Triangle to South Lake Union Park and Fred Hutchinson Cancer Research Center every 10 to 15 minutes. This affordable and attractive neighborhood transit service connects the growing Denny Triangle and South Lake Union neighborhoods to the regional transit hub where Sound Transit light rail, the monorail and regional buses converge. www.seattlestreetcar.org

Trains

Three Amtrak trains arrive and depart at historic King Street Station (303 S Jackson St.), providing service to Vancouver, B.C., Tacoma, Portland, Spokane and other destinations. King Street Station is located between the International District and Pioneer Square, just north of Qwest Field. Tickets may be purchased online or at the station. Greyhound tickets are also sold at the station.

The Sounder is a commuter train running from Seattle to Everett and from Seattle to Tacoma. The trains are boarded at King Street Station. www.soundtransit.org/x1218.xml

Washington State Ferries

Washington state has the largest ferry fleet in the nation. From Colman Dock at Pier 52, travelers and their vehicles can take a ferry to Bremerton or Bainbridge Island. A passenger-only ferry goes from Colman Dock to Vashon Island. The Fauntleroy ferry in West Seattle takes passengers and cars to Vashon Island and Southworth on the Kitsap Peninsula.
